By Car Time required to Miyazu Amanohashidate Interchange by expressway.









Mysterious Japanese Landscape AMANO HASHIDATE

Amanohashidate, located in Miyazu Bay on the Sea of Japan in northern Kyoto Prefecture, is one of Japan's Three Most Scenic Spots, along with Matsushima in Miyagi Prefecture and Miyajima in Hiroshima Prefecture. The terrain formed over thousands of years is extremely rare, and when viewed from the surrounding high ground, it looks like a land bridge stretching into the sky, which is why it was given its name.

It is a tourist destination that can be enjoyed in a variety of ways. This could include the view from the observation deck, strolling through the pine forest, or enjoying the view from a boat.



What is "Matanozoki"?

This is a traditional posture for viewing Amanohashidate. Stand at the observatory with your back to Amanohashidate and bend forward to look through the legs.

The sea and sky are reversed, creating a mystical scene in which Amanohashidate looks like a bridge spanning the sky.



North Area

This is an observation point where you can get a panoramic view of Amanohashidate from the north. The view from here is called shoryukan because the overpass looks like a dragon rising into the sky.

It is also said that Kasamatsu Park is the birthplace of the matanozoki (looking between the legs).





Motoise Kono Shrine Details Page







This shrine has a history of over 1,300 years. Within the shrine grounds, there is a device called suikinkutsu that allows you to hear the mysterious sound of water flowing underground. This mystical sound will soothe your soul.

Nariaiji Temple 2 Details Page





Located on the mountainside near Amanohashidate, this temple is famous for granting wishes. It is also said that if you visit the temple, you will beautify your body and mind. The gardens are also attractive, with cherry blossoms and rhododendrons in the spring and autumn leaves in the fall.





Moniu Southern Area

Amanohashidate View Land Details Page .



This is an observation point that offers a panoramic view of Amanohashidate from the south. The view from here looks like a dragon dancing in the sky, so it's been nicknamed hiryukan. There are also rides such as a Ferris wheel and cycle cars, making it a place that can be enjoyed by anyone, regardless of age or gender.



Chionji Temple Details Page



This temple enshrines Manjusri Bodhisattva, the Buddhist god who bestows wisdom. It is said that those who visit the temple will become smarter, so many students taking exams visit every year. You can experience historical cultural properties, such as a pagoda that has been designated as an Important Cultural Property of Japan.

Chie no Mochi Rice Cakes __Details Page __



A traditional sweet from Amanohashidate that is said to grant wisdom to those who eat them. They are small rice cakes wrapped in sweet red bean paste. Only four tea shops make them and they are not available for sale online nor at the station kiosk.

Miyazu City Seafood Gourmet

The area around Amanohashidate offers a wide variety of fresh seafood such as crabs, fish, and shellfish. You can enjoy seafood unique to the area surrounded by the Sea of Japan at unique restaurants and hotels.



Matsuba crab

Matsuba crab, whose fishing season opens in November every year, is a delicacy of winter in the Sea of Japan area. It is attractive because of its good shape, filling meat, and sweet flavor. Many restaurants offer a variety of crab dishes such as grilled crab, hot pot, and sashimi.

Yellowtail

Yellowtail from the Sea of Japan is characterized by its fatty meat and delicious flavor. Yellowtail is in season from December to February each year, and can be enjoyed in such dishes as buri shabu(yellowtail hot pot) a specialty that originated in Miyazu City.

Port town with a long history Miyazu City Highlights




Miyazu City in Kyoto Prefecture has many other sights to see in addition to Amanohashidate. Miyazu City, which faces the Sea of Japan, prospered as a port town where trading ships docked from the Edo period (1603-1868). In the city, there are elegant architectural structures that remind us of those days. Away from the center of the city, there is a rich natural environment where one can enjoy beautiful scenery in each of the four seasons. Furthermore, historical events such as fireworks displays and traditional festivals are held throughout the year. Why not take a trip to Miyazu City that is different from ordinary tours?

Sights All Miyazu area

All of these places can be reached in 10 to 40 minutes by car from Amanohashidate.













This former of a merchant house was built more than 200 years ago, it is an important cultural property of Japan. The exterior has white plaster walls, and inside the house, visitors can see old household items once used in Japan and a Japanese indoor courtyard garden.

This dynamic waterfall is 40 meters high and 20 meters wide. It has been selected as one of the "The 100 Best Waterfalls in Japan" as a wonderful waterfall worth seeing. Many people visit during the summer because it is cool to get close to feel the waterfall's cool spray.



Yura River Bridge



This is a railroad bridge that spans the mouth of the Yura River, east of Amanohashidate. This red bridge was built in the Taisho Period (1912-1926) and is approximately 551 meters long. Visitors can ride across the bridge on a train, making it a popular photo spot.



Seya Village 💷

It is a peaceful mountain village where many old-style thatched roof houses still remain and the original Japanese landscape can be seen. Visitors can enjoy nature as it changes from season to season, with cherry blossoms in spring and snowy landscapes in winter.

Festivals Miyazu Traditions

Traditional festivals held annually at temples and shrines, as well as events popular among tourists, are introduced here.



Jun.10 Toka Ebisu



This event is held at Chionji Temple and is visited by many people every year to wish for a happy new year.



Apr.24 Aoi Festival



This is a festival of Motoise Kono Shrine, which has a history of about 2,500 years and is famous for its sword dance.




May.13-15 Miyazu Festival
